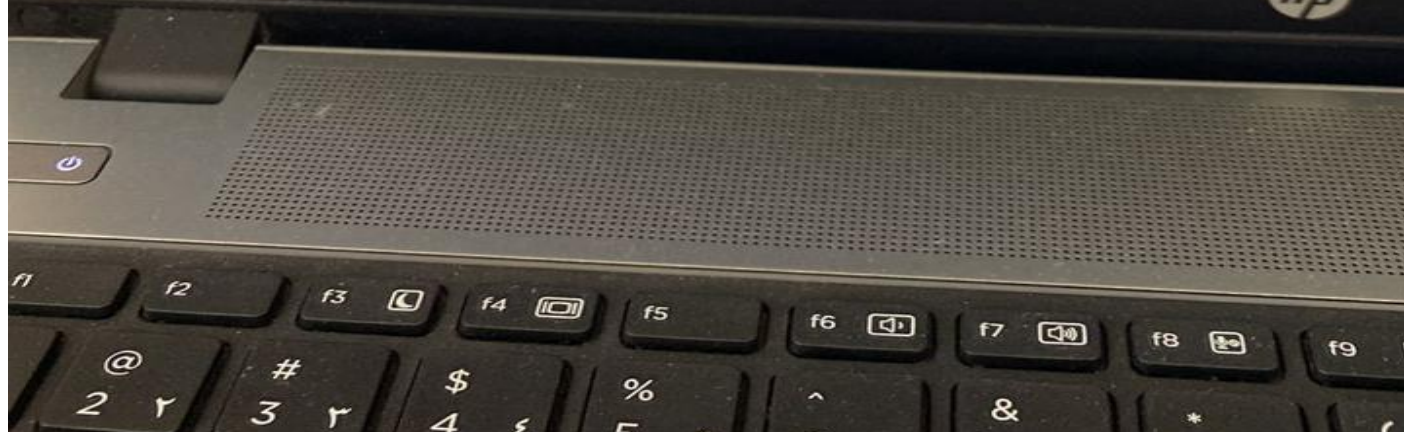

In the 1970s, apple growers in the Hawkes Bay area of New Zealand were facing the death of their most successful product, the Royal Gala apple, known as the Queen's apple. And now it's happening again to the Queen's successor – the Goldcrisp.

The Royal Gala apple is very popular. It has a unique taste, and it was easy to transport because it is hard, which helps protect the fruit inside. As a result, the Royal Gala dominated the apple orchards and gardens of Hawkes Bay in the last thirty years of the 20th century. During this period, the main grower and exporter in the region was Sunny Valley Orchards. The company mass-produced its apples in the most efficient way possible: it took the stems of small apple plants, copied them in agricultural laboratories and replanted them instead of growing new plants from seeds. These plants were cultivated in densely packed fields so as to produce greater quantities of fruit.

Unfortunately, these tightly packed fields were also ideal for the spread of the fungus *Boriseedum Boziolis*. It attacked the plant's roots and prevented it from transporting water to the stem and leaves. It would travel around on workers' boots or the tyres of trucks, spreading rapidly and infecting orchards or large apple farms across the region. However, the greatest challenge facing farmers with this TR-1 strain of the fungus was its resistance to pesticides and other crop sprays, which it would survive. Farmers attempted to escape the fungus by abandoning infected fields or flooding them. They also replanted crops somewhere else, often digging up protected land to do so.

In the last ten years, NASA has identified most of the large asteroids within 75 million km of earth with only 2% still unfound. NASA says it has found 3097, and they believe that there are around fifty more to find. In the short-term, they believe that only a few could be a danger to the planet, but this may increase in the future.



NASA is also now trying to identify some of the smaller asteroids, which measure 140 metres wide or more. When we think that a 19-metre asteroid, which was travelling at 25,000 kmph, exploded above the city of Chelyabinsk in Russia in 2013 and injured 1,200 people, these mid-sized asteroids would be a danger to the Earth.

To solve this problem, NASA needs to build a large and expensive space telescope which would use infrared light to find these smaller asteroids. They already have the money, but they need a long period to build it, and with this, NASA could probably find the asteroids in ten years. When they find them, the military would be able to defend the planet against being hit by the most dangerous asteroids. These are the nearest, at less than 3 million kilometres from Earth.
